

Construction Update

The faculty and staff, students, and administrators want to thank you for your contribution on passing the bond. Because of your belief in the school, we were able to put up a new gym and school roof to keep us from leaking and damages that were occurring due to the

numerous leaks. The main roof is not completely finished as weather has forced a halt on construction. However, Porter Roof Co. has said that once the weather subsides, work will begin and the completion will be soon thereafter.

Once the roof is complete, the remaining companies, school board, and administrators will set a definite timeline to expedite the process. The Superintendent, Ryan Middleton, has made it very clear that he does not want a disturbance during the critical testing time for any of the students and will make certain that disruption is minimal at all other times.

The school will see new windows, lighting (LED throughout), drop-down ceilings, a safer entry-way, and HVAC,


