New Business:

Sports Banquets

HS Girls Basketball Uniforms

A portion of the cost (\$500) was already allotted to the girls' basketball program and the rest Booster Club covered as part of the uniform replacement schedule.

It was suggested that uniforms should last at least 4 years. It was noted Cross Country uniforms had not been replaced by the Booster Club for 12 years. Cheerleaders did not wear uniforms in 2020 and could potentially replace uniforms in a different year.
