The LEA conducts yearly parental surveys in the spring of each year and then makes adjustments to the current plan that the committee deems necessary. During our spring annual evaluation meeting (which includes parents, teachers and admin), we discuss strengths and weaknesses of areas that need improvement. We look at Star reading and math data to ensure students are making adequate progress. We also have a meeting with admin and teacher leadership to evaluate all programs including our title I program.

Describe method(s) for identifying barriers

Direct certification, free/reduced meal applications, McKinney Vento. A barrier we face is the parents that do not turn in the free & reduced application at the beginning of the year. Since we are so small we have been able to make personal home visits and assist parents in filling out the application correctly. This application can be overwhelming and the support we provide parents has been appreciated.

The needs of parents and family members to assist with the learning of their children, including engaging with school personnel and teachers

Describe method(s) for identifying needs

Parental surveys and annual meetings. Our average class size is 5 students. Our teachers frequently communicate with parents and send home learning activities/games that parents can use to assist their child(ren) at home. All of our parents communicate with the teacher using Remind and this helps to ensure all parent questions or issues with learning are answered in a timely manner.

Describe method(s) for identifying strategies

Family nights, annual meetings, communication to home via paper, social media, parent portal. Our teachers collaborate to decide what learning standards need to be practiced during our family engagement nights. We make sure to focus on priority standards at each grade level and scaffold in support as needed. We believe that by looking at our data, we can provide appropriate instruction that will ensure student success.
